Gotthold [Becker] broke his leg in 2 places jumping hurdles with his horse on 1st Dec. He will have to stay in bed another 5 weeks. We have 3 days reaping to do yet. The harvest is not so good this year. Edelgaarde said to tell you to bring your youngest boy she would like to see him.
