He was baptized on the  $21^{st}$  and his name is Albert Heinrich. We call him Albert.

Tomorrow Richard, Edel, Mathilda and Sofie will go to Adelaide. Next Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> March they will go to Angas Park by mid-day mail [coach ?]. They will visit you then.

I want to close this letter soon as writing is quite hard on me yet, and you will hear everything when they get there.

We had a fairly heavy thunderstorm last Tuesday, with heavy rain. I've never seen gloods like this one. Everything is under water.

Bertha, perhaps you could come and visit us when Matilde comes. I want to close now in hopes that you are all well, and these lines find you in good health, as they leave us.
